## Introduction

AIIMS Raipur is one of the new apex healthcare institutes established by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojna (PMSSY) on the pattern of AIIMS, New Delhi. The institute was established with the aim of correcting regional imbalances in quality tertiary level healthcare in the region and attaining self sufficiency in graduate and postgraduate medical education and training in this hitherto under-served area of the country. The institute got operational from the year 2012.

## Mission Statement

To establish a centre of excellence in medical education, training, health care and research imbued with scientific culture, compassion for the sick and commitment to serve the under-served.

## Location

AIIMS, Raipur is situated at NH-6, GE Road, Tatibandh, Raipur with a total area of 103.63 Acres. This includes Hospital and College Complex (63.85 Acres) and Residential Complex in Kabir Nagar (39.78 Acres).

## Medical and Nursing Colleges

Construction work of the Institute commenced in mid-2010.

All the pre-clinical departments of the Medical College viz. Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry are functional and located in their respective earmarked spaces. The para-clinical departments of the medical college viz. Pathology, Microbiology, Pharmacology, Forensic Medicine & Toxicology and Community and Family Medicine are located in their respective earmarked spaces and are in the process of being functional.

A separate building for the College of Nursing is under construction. Meanwhile, facilities in the Medical college building are being utilized for teaching activities for nursing students.

### Residential area (Kabir Nagar)

Residential accommodation is available in the Residential Campus of the institute located in Kabir Nagar, Raipur. Distance between the Residential Complex and AIIMS Hospital is approx. 3.5 km. A fully furnished guest house is also available within the residential campus. One block each of Type III, IV and V; 2 blocks each of Type I and II; Director Bungalow are constructed. The Director, faculty members and the students are residing in the campus.

#### **Hostels:**

The hostel block is located within the hospital /medical college campus and is being readied for occupation. As an interim measure,

students have been accommodated in the Type II and Type III buildings in the residential campus.

### Additional Land

- **Additional land at Sarona:** 54 Acres additional land at Sarona has been approved and is being allotted to AIIMS, Raipur.
- **Additional Land at Naya Raipur:** Additional land of 100 Acres in Naya Raipur has been demanded by AIIMS Raipur for establishing School of Public Health, Research Block and Outreach Centre. The allotment of land is under process.

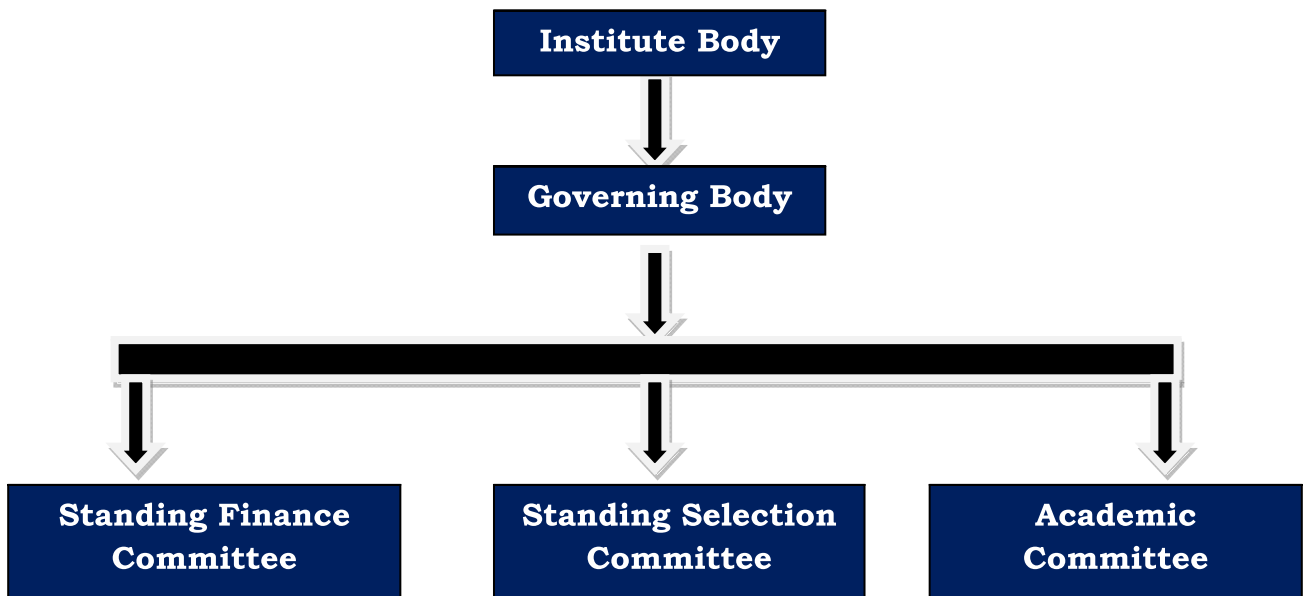
### Development of Sarona Railway Station

### 13. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

#### 1. ACCOUNTING CONCEPTS

The financial statement are prepared on the basis of the historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and on the accrual method of accounting.

#### 2. INVENTORY VALUATION

2.1 Stores and Spares (including machinery spares) are valued at cost.

2.2 Raw Materials, semi finished goods are valued at lower of cost and net realizable value. The cost are based on weighted average cost. Cost of finished goods and semi finished goods is determined by considering material, labour and overheads.

#### 3. INVESTMENTS

Investments classified as “long term investments” are carried at cost. Provision for decline, other than temporary, is made in carrying cost of such investment.

#### 4. FIXED ASSETS

4.1 Fixed Assets are stated at the cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes, incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition. In respect of projects involving construction, related preoperational expenses (including interest on loans for specific projects prior to its completion) form part of the value of the asset capitalized.

4.2 Fixed Asset received by way of non-monetary grants, (other than towards the Corpus Fund), are capitalized at values stated, by corresponding credit to Capital Reserves.

#### 5. DEPRECIATION

5.1 Depreciation is provided on w.d.v. method as per rates specified in the Income Tax Act 1961 except depreciation on cost adjustments arising on account of conversion of foreign currency liabilities for acquisition of fixed asset, which is amortized over the residual life of the respective assets.

5.2 In respect of additions to/deduction from fixed asset during the years, depreciation is considered on pro-rata basis.

5.3 Asset costing Rs. 5000 or less are fully provided.

#### 6. GOVERNMENT GRANTS/SUBSIDIES

6.1 Government grants of nature of contribution towards capital cost of setting up projects are treated as Capital Reserves.

6.2 Government grant/subsidy are accounted on realizable basis.

## Separate Audit Report (F.Y. 2012-13)

### Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Raipur (Chhattisgarh) for the year ended 31 March 2013.

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Raipur (Chhattisgarh) as at 31 March 2013, the Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with section 18 (2) of the AIIMS Act, 1956 and the AIIMS (Amendment) Act, 2012. These financial statements are the responsibility of the AIIMS's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/CAG's Audit Reports separately.

3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the management as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

4. Based on our audit, we report that:

(i) We have obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;

(ii) The Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by the Ministry of Finance, Government of India.

(iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts as required under section 18(1) of the AIIMS Act, 1956 and other relevant records have been maintained by the AIIMS, Raipur in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.

(iv) We further report that:

**A Balance Sheet**

**Liabilities**

**A.1.1 Current Liabilities & Provisions (Schedule-2)-` 4.12 lakh**

The AIIMS has neither deducted the employee's contribution nor made provision of ` 7.02 lakh for the Institute's share of pension contribution under the New Pension Scheme. This resulted in understatement of provisions and expenditure by ` 7.02 lakh. AIIMS, Raipur has also not provided for other retirement benefits on actuarial valuation basis as required under AS-15 and instructions contained in the Uniform Format of Accounts (UFA).

**Assets**

**A.2.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule-3)- ` 60.21 lakh**

No depreciation on fixed assets has been provided with corresponding reduction of capital accounts. Consequently the Capital fund and Assets accounts were overstated by ` 6.21 lakh and Expenditure understated by the same amount.

Non-charging of depreciation was also not in consonance with Institute's Significant Accounting Policies (point no. 5 of Schedule-13) wherein it has been disclosed that depreciation on assets was to be provided on Written Down Value method as per rates specified in Income Tax Act, 1961.

**B. Income & Expenditure Account**

**Expenditure**

**B.1 Other Administrative Expenses etc. (Schedule -11) 1.47 crore**

This includes ` 12.78 lakh being payment made (31<sup>st</sup> December 2012 and 1<sup>st</sup> February 2013 and 11<sup>th</sup> March 2013) on behalf of students to M/s Shree Sai Services for providing hostel mess services. This amount was received back in June 2013 from students and recouped to AIIMS fund. As the expenditure does not pertain to AIIMS, Raipur it should not have been taken in the Income and Expenditure account. This

resulted in overstatement of Expenditure and understatement of Sundry Debtors by ` 12.78 lakh.

#### **Effect of Audit Comments on Accounts**

The net impact of the comments given in the preceding paras is that the Assets, Liabilities and Expenditure were understated by ` 6.57 lakh, ` 0.81 lakh and ` 0.45 lakh respectively.

#### **D Grant-in-aid**

Out of the GIA of ` 17.50 crore received during the year ( ` 1.00 crore received during February 2012 for 2011-12), the Institute could utilize a sum of ` 4.07 crore leaving a balance of ` 13.43 crore as unutilized grant as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2013. Further, the Institute had internal receipts of ` 12.41 lakh during the year which remained unutilised as on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2013.

(v) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipt and Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.

(vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the accounting policies and Notes on Accounts and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this audit report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- a. In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Raipur as at 31 March 2013; and
- b. In so far as it relates to the Income and Expenditure Account of the surplus for the year ended on that date.

### Annexure to Audit Report

**1. Adequacy of Internal Audit System:**

Internal audit of AIIMS, Raipur has been conducted during 21.01.2014 to 31.01.2014 by the Internal Audit Wing of office of the Chief Controller of Accounts, New Delhi. The Institute has submitted its reply on 28<sup>th</sup> April 2014 on the audit paras.

**2. Adequacy of Internal Control System:**

The internal control system was found to be inadequate due to:-

- (1) Long term/short term plans and targets along with budgets were not prepared.
- (2) Meetings of the Governing Body was to be conducted once in a quarter at such place, date and time as may be decided by the Chairman but the Governing Body was not formed till the end of the year.
- (3) Basic record of payments i.e. payment vouchers have not been prepared in the prescribed and printed form and have not been numbered and arranged serially.
- (4) Cash book has not been maintained in prescribed form and was not closed regularly.
- (5) Expenditure control register and Sanction register have been not maintained.

**3. System of Physical Verification of Fixed Assets:**

The stock registers for fixed assets have not been maintained in proper format i.e. GFR Form-40. Stock entries have neither been signed by any authority nor physical verification made till date by the Institute.

**4. Physical Verification of Inventories:**

Stock register of Inventories have not been maintained nor physical verification of such inventories made by the Institute during the year.

**5. Regularity in payment of statutory dues:**

No irregularity was noticed in the payment of statutory dues.

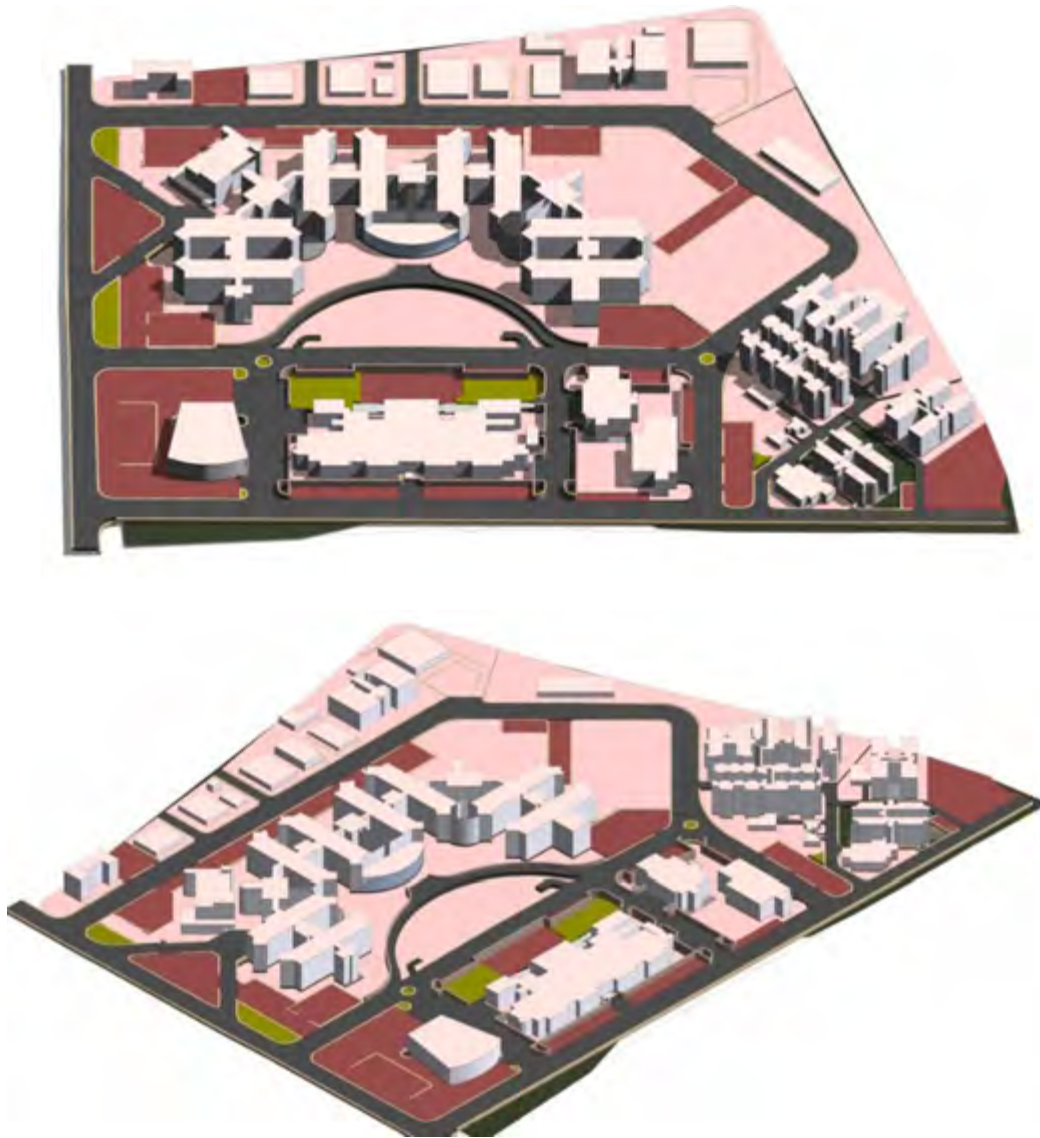
